## 2002 CABERNET SAUVIGNON

The 2002 Vintage produced great Cabernet Sauvignon. This amazing vintage, when the Barossa experienced the coolest summer on record, meant that ripening conditions were perfect for this noble red wine variety.

The 2002 Cabernet Sauvignon represents Barossa at its best. An intensely coloured wine simply oozing ripe black currants, it has a richly textured palate, superb length and beautifully balanced fine tannins. A wine for the cellar!

- Colour:* Dense black red
- Bouquet:* Black forest fruits with hints of aniseed and a whisper of toasted oak.
- Palate:* Shows extraordinary velvet richness and depth with the voluptuous black currant flavours harnessed by the complex oak characters and soft fine-grained tannins. A wine of superbly controlled power.
- Wood:* 12 months maturation in a mixture of French and American oak hogsheads.
- The Vineyards:* Barossa Valley
- Cellaring:* Cellared carefully, this wine will continue to develop for 10 plus years.
- Alc/Vol:* 14.5%
- Enjoy With:* Roast duck, a hearty beef stew, pink lamb and good mature cheddars.
